Please check the public notice boxes mounted on the light poles by the bridges, parkway, and Village Hall door for announcements.



Garlic Mustard Pull





Garlic mustard grows aggressively, far outpacing native species. Left untreated, it will spread and choke out our precious native plants.

Our goal is to remove all the plants **before** they go to seed.

The best time to do this is early spring, while the plants are small, and no bugs are out!

Join your neighbors and do your part in the North Bay Ravines this spring!

What to bring:

Shoes that can get muddy, gloves if you want them, and a pointed hand shovel. We will supply brown paper bags for collecting the garlic mustard.

Best Pulling Method:

Grab hold of the plant at its base, loosen root with a shovel and pull straight up – don't pull at an angle. Knock the soil off the roots, bag in paper bags, and drop them off in the rear of the Village Hall.



Increasingly garlic mustard can be found in lawns. Proper removal is the homeowner's responsibility

Call if you need help identifying it, and we will demonstrate the best pulling method

Early Spring, Low green leaf

Please DO NOT dispose of garlic mustard in a compost pile or in the trash! Collect in paper bags and drop them off in the rear of the Village Hall
