When completing your individual Wisconsin Income Tax returns, please indicate the Tax District on page 1 as the Village of NORTH BAY, County of RACINE and School District Number 4620. This information will provide the Village with valuable tax credits.

### **2020 DOG LICENSE REMINDER**

If you own a dog, please complete and return the dog license application inserted with your tax bill. Additional applications are available on the [Village website](#). A \$5 penalty will be applied after April 1. State law requires dogs 5 months of age or older to be licensed each year. Owners of unregistered dogs may be cited by the Wind Point Police Department for non-compliance with local and state statutes.

Online voter registration is available now through March 18th, 2020 to eligible Wisconsin Voters who have a current and valid Wisconsin Driver License or Wisconsin State ID Card! Your name, date of birth, Wisconsin Driver License or State ID number, and address must all match the information on file with the Wisconsin DMV. Pre-registered voters must present a valid photo ID

**Public Comment**

Did you know every Board Meeting begins with Public Comment? North Bay adopted guidelines recommended by the Wisconsin Municipal Clerks Association to promote a positive environment and ensure respect and dignity for every attendee. North Bay Board of Trustees Meetings begin with a 15 minute Public Comment period to hear resident concerns. Residents who wish to engage in a dialogue beyond the scope of Public Comment are encouraged to request an appointment with the Board Member who oversees the matter of concern.

Board of Trustees Meeting Public Comment Guidelines

- Public Comment is heard during the first 15 minutes at the start of Board of Trustees Meetings.
- Individuals wishing to address the Board are asked to sign in 10 minutes before the scheduled start time, noting the speaker’s name, address and the topic they wish to speak on.
- The topic must be related to Village policy or business.
- One 3 minute comment per topic per meeting is heard.
- The speaker is asked to clearly state their name, address and topic for public record.
- Each speaker is limited to 3 minutes. A timer is displayed to ensure all speakers are allotted their full 3 minutes.
- Speakers may not give their time allotment to other people.
- Public comments are presented orally.
- Public Comment is a time for community input and not a discussion with the board. The Chair may provide brief factual information, if appropriate.
- Input or questions that require a response will be addressed in a timely manner at a later date.
