Man injured in rollover crash

SOMERS — A man was injured in a single-vehicle accident at Highway E and Sheridan Road on Sunday.

Authorities with the Kenosha County Sheriff's Department and emergency personnel responded to the crash at about 10 a.m. in which a van had rolled over and was discovered on its roof when deputies arrived, according to Somers Fire Chief Carson Wilkinson. The vehicle had also struck a traffic standard with a streetlight, he said.

Wilkinson said rescue personnel took the man to Froedtert Kenosha Hospital for further evaluation and treatment for non-life-threatening injuries. The man's condition was not known as of Sunday. Wilkinson said Fire Department and rescue personnel remained on scene for about an hour and a half.

The crash forced a partial closure of the south and northbound lanes at the intersection. The cause of the crash remains under investigation.

Funding sought for Highway W repairs

Kenosha County Board to consider measure tonight

WHEATLAND — County officials are recommending building a retaining wall to shore up a portion of Kenosha County Highway W, which is on the verge of tumbling into the Fox River.

A request for up to \$300,000 to pay for the fix was approved by the Kenosha County Finance/Administration Committee Thursday.

"The Highway Division did a study and found that

a sheet pile retaining wall is the best option to fix the problem," Highway Director Clement Abongwa said.

The highway has been closed since October when the river bank eroded to the point it affected the pavement. A short-term fix was deemed unfeasible.

Abongwa said the cost of the repair is not included in the 2020 budget. He said it will be treated as an emergency repair. The department is asking to bond up to \$300,000 for the project.

The recommendation to fund the project will go before the Kenosha County Board at its meeting today.

VOTING BY ABSENTEE BALLOT FOR THE FEBRUARY 18, 2020 SPRING PRIMARY ELECTION

Any qualified elector who is unable or unwilling to appear at the polling place on Election Day may request to vote an absentee ballot. A qualified elector is any U.S. citizen, who will be 18 years of age or older on Election Day, who has resided in the ward or municipality where he or she wishes to vote for at least 10 consecutive days before the election. The elector must also be registered in order to receive an absentee ballot. Proof of identification must be provided before an absentee ballot may be issued, unless the elector is otherwise exempt from this requirement.

You must make a request for an absentee ballot in writing.

Contact your municipal clerk and request that an application for an absentee ballot be sent to you for the primary or election or both. You may also submit a written request in the form of a letter. Your written request must list your voting address within the municipality where you wish to vote, the address where the absentee ballot should be sent, if different, and your signature. You may make application for an absentee ballot by mail or in person.

Making application to receive an absentee ballot by mail

The deadline for making application to receive an absentee ballot by mail is:
5 pm on the fifth day before the election, February 13th, 2020.

Note: Special absentee voting application provisions apply to electors who are indefinitely confined to home or a care facility, in the military, hospitalized, or serving as a sequestered juror. If this applies to you, contact the municipal clerk regarding deadlines for requesting and submitting an absentee ballot.

Voting an absentee ballot in person

You may also request and vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office or other specified location during the days and hours specified for casting an absentee ballot in person.

Authorities identify Madison homicide victim as Chicagoan

MADISON — Authorities have identified the victim of a homicide Saturday on the West Side as a Chicago man.

The Dane County Medical Examiner's Office said Antonio R. Stidhum, 20, died from homicidal firearm violence.

Madison police are asking for the public's assistance as its Violent Crime Unit continues to investigate the homicide. Stidhum's body was found in an apartment at 1905 McKenna Blvd. shortly after 2:30 p.m. Saturday.

Police are asking anyone

who was around the area of Raymond Road and McKenna Boulevard between 1:30 and 3 p.m. Saturday, who may have seen something unusual or may have any other information related to the homicide, to contact Madison Area Crime Stoppers at 608-266-6014.

No suspects or motive have been identified, police spokesman Joel DeSpain said Sunday.

Officers went to the scene after someone in the apartment building reported gunshots. They found the victim, who had several gunshot wounds, alone inside an apartment, DeSpain said. Officers attempted

life-saving measures but were unsuccessful.

Police said they believe Stidhum was targeted. He was not a resident of the apartment, DeSpain said, and police are not yet aware of why he was in the apartment or why he was targeted there.

DeSpain said the primary tenant of the apartment where the fatal shooting took place, a woman, has been cooperating with police, but it is "not clear" what the relationship is between her and Stidhum.

This is the first homicide in Madison this year. There were four homicides in the city in 2019.
