Important facts...

- Online applications submitted through 5 PM today were mailed. Online applications submitted between 5 PM today through 5 PM on April 2nd will be mailed no later than Friday, April 3rd. Ballot delivery IS NOT guaranteed due to unpredictable US Postal service delivery times. If you do not receive your Ballot by April 7th, you may vote curbside on Election Day.
- **Voters are encouraged to personally deliver their Absentee Ballot, sealed in the return envelope provided, to Village Hall. Simply insert it in the mail slot of the Village Hall door, Please do not insert it into the mailbox at the street.** Ballots will remain sealed and securely locked until Election Day.
- All Absentee Ballots must be RECEIVED at Village Hall on Election Day to be counted.
- If MyVote.wi.gov is unable to locate your voter registration, please contact Clerk Panthofer.

CURBSIDE VOTING ONLY | 7 AM- 8 PM

- Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Village Hall is closed to the public.
- In person voting is available CURBSIDE ONLY!
- A tent will be set up to shelter officials and voters from inclement weather.
- Voters and Officials will abide by current social distancing mandates.
- Ballot markers will be sanitized between each use.
- Single use privacy sleeves will be used for each ballot.

CAR VOTER(S):

- From North Vincennes, turn south on Hennepin.
- At the bridge, check for oncoming traffic, and, if clear, cross over to the EAST side of the street and pull up to the tent, **driver side to the curb.**
- Check for PEDESTRIAN VOTERS before pulling up to the Voting Tent.
- If a PEDESTRIAN VOTER is present, please wait until the Pedestrian walks away before pulling up to the tent.
- State name and present valid photo ID to Election Officials. The Officials will issue and record the ballot number in the Poll Book in accordance with WEC Curbside Voting guidelines.
- If more than one voter is in the car, the Officials will assist one voter at time.
- Voters are encouraged to remain at the curb until the Election Officials verifies the voting machine accepts the Ballot. If the Voting Machine rejects the ballot, the Election Officials will return to the Voter with options.
- Upon verification by the Election Officials that the voting machine collected the ballot, carefully check for cross traffic before pulling away from the curb and returning to the correct lane.



PEDESTRIAN VOTER(S):

- If a car is currently at the tent, wait on the SIDEWALK 6 feet SOUTH of the nearest Official and/or CAR until the Official indicates you may approach.
- State name and present valid photo ID to Election Officials. The Officials will issue and record the ballot number in the Poll Book in accordance with WEC Curbside Voting guidelines.
- Voters are encouraged to remain at the curb until the Election Officials verifies the voting machine accepts the Ballot. If the Voting Machine rejects the ballot, the Election Officials will return to the Voter with options.
- Upon verification by the Election Officials that the voting machine collected the ballot, the pedestrian voter may depart.

YARD WASTE COLLECTION BEGINS APRIL 6TH

As posted on the VNB website ([Public Works page](#) and [Calendar](#)), yard waste collection April through November. This year, the first yard waste collection day of the season is Monday, April 6 and collections will continue weekly through November 30. All yard waste must be tagged. Yard waste bags may be purchased at a local hardware or department store. **Please do not set yard waste bags or branch collection out sooner than 72 hours before collection day.**

Yard waste that should be bagged and tagged:

- Leaves
- Grass clippings
- Yard and garden debris
- Brush, including clean woody vegetative material no greater than 4 inches in diameter

Yard waste that should be tagged:

- Branches (bundled and secured with twine)
- Roots or shrubs with intact root balls
- Stumps

HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION CANCELLED | 4/18/20 & 5/16/20

Due to the COVID-19 Pandemic, the Racine Wastewater Utility's Household Hazardous Waste Collection events scheduled for Saturday, April 18, 2020 and Saturday, May 16, 2020 at 6200 21st Street for residents of the City of Racine, Caledonia, Elmwood Park, Mount Pleasant, North Bay, Sturtevant & Wind Point have been cancelled. Residents are encouraged to keep their unwanted household hazardous waste (such as oil paint, pesticides, pool chemicals, antifreeze, rechargeable batteries and other hazardous substances) until the next scheduled Racine Wastewater Utility's Household Hazardous Waste Collection event currently scheduled for Saturday, June 20, 2020 from 8:00 a.m. until 1:00 p.m. at 6200 21st Street (west of Hwy 31).
