Garlic Mustard Pull

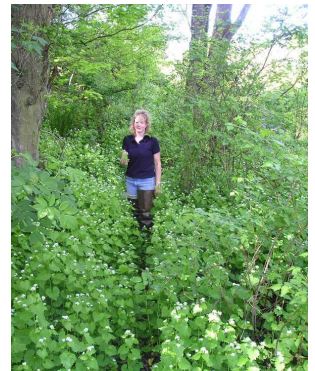
The ravine that runs through North Bay is our own little wildlife sanctuary, home to many beautiful Wisconsin native wildflowers. It is a treasure that requires our care.

Please join your neighbors & help remove garlic mustard from our ravine.

Garlic Mustard is one of the worst invasive weeds in the US. It displaces native plants, grows aggressively in sun or shade, and it is in our ravine and in our yards.

- Unchecked, it can destroy the native growth of a woodland within 3 years (see photos to the right).
- Garlic mustard spreads faster than dandelions and ***comes back every year.***
- If you don't remove it from your yard, it will soon be your neighbor's problem.

This is the best time to pick! The ground is wet and makes for easy pulling. All you need is a hand shovel and a bag. We will show you the best method to remove the **whole taproot**, and we will take the garlic mustard away for disposal.
